CITY COUNCIL MEETING
June 5, 2012**

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

CITY OF LONG LAKE UPDATE

Mayor Hultmann encouraged shopping locally in the Long Lake area whenever possible to support the community's businesses; and highlighted summer events coming to Long Lake including a rowing regatta, and SummerFest.

He also advised that Highway 12 would be closed from Friday, June 15 through Monday, June 18 for installation of rumble strips and striping work on the highway. Additionally, Brown Road will be closed the week of June 11 between Fox Street and Watertown Road for a county culvert repair project.

OPEN CORRESPONDENCE

Tim Litfin, Minnetonka Community Education / Tour de Tonka

Mr. Litfin reviewed the history of the Tour de Tonka ride initiative and provided information regarding rider participation; routes and rest stops; how to contact the Tour de Tonka organization to participate or volunteer; and further, he emphasized that the Tour de Tonka is a ride, not a race event. Mr. Litfin presented Mayor Hultmann with a plaque in appreciation of the City's past support for the Tour de Tonka.

Mayor Hultmann recalled past safety concerns as a result of cyclists disregarding traffic signage. He asked that event organizers make extra effort to explain to all participants that the Tour de Tonka is a ride, not a race; and therefore riders must obey all traffic signage and signals.

BUSINESS ITEMS

OTHER BUSINESS

Downtown Parking Subcommittee – Council member Skjaret reported that he is expecting the Council will receive an update from the Planning Commission downtown parking subcommittee within the next 60 days.

CSAH 112 PAC / TAC Agendas – Council member Skjaret thanked Administrator Post for forwarding agendas for the CSAH 112 advisory committee meetings and asked to continue receiving them.

Park Board Liaison Report – Council member Chillstrom indicated that at the Park Board's last meeting they continued their discussion of signage changes for trailheads and in parks. He also noted that Park Board member Bob Hardin is recovering well from his recent surgery and subsequent stroke.

CSAH 112 Turnback Planning – Council member Olson expressed concern about the County's intent to include a center lane on CSAH 112 through downtown Long Lake in their planning for the roadway, and requested the Planning Commission downtown parking subcommittee consider the ramifications of a center lane on availability of on street parking. Council and staff discussed the possible impact of a center lane, and the need for continued city involvement in the CSAH 112 planning process to assure the city's goals are given consideration.

Updated Population Estimate – Post informed the Council that the Metropolitan Council had updated their population estimate for Long Lake, estimating the city's population at 1,775. The new estimate is an increase over the last estimate issued.

A motion was made by Chillstrom, seconded by Skjaret to adjourn the meeting. Ayes: all. The meeting was adjourned at 6:37 pm.
