CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION  
June 20, 2017**

**CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 pm.

**BUSINESS ITEMS**

**City Council Applicant Interviews**

6:00 pm – 6:15 pm / Charlie Miner

Charlie Miner, 59 Apple Glen Road – Mr. Miner stated his continued interest in helping to make a difference as best he can in his community. He reflected upon the Council's work with the County Road 112 project and that as a project is completed, pressure upon the City to grow and develop may present a challenge to Long Lake maintaining the character of its community. Other areas of interest for him relate to park cleanliness and enhancement; and in being supportive of City staff and providing staff with the tools and resources needed to best accomplish their work on the City's behalf. He expressed appreciation to the City Council for his recent appointment to the Planning Commission, and in going over zoning requirements for residential zoning districts during recent meetings, he had realized that being a part of focusing on achieving clarity and reducing ambiguity of ordinance language for ease of use and guidance was of interest to him. In his work experience, he has spent significant time interpreting statutes and writing or rewriting ordinances – largely related to parking and traffic. He noted that the Council has done a great job in its work over the last several years, but the next few years will be unusually demanding and challenging as the County Road 112 project continues to come through. Looking ahead, he hopes to see that any vacant land is used for quality development. He expressed his appreciation to the Council for the opportunity to interview for the vacant Council seat, adding that he had not anticipated an opportunity to be available so soon.

6:15 pm – 6:30 pm / Timothy (Tim) Hultmann

Tim Hultmann, 280 Lakeview Avenue – Mr. Hultmann recalled his experiences as a City Council member, Planning Commission member and Mayor, discussing the history of the Highway 12 bypass project and follow through to the resulting County Road 112 reconstruction project now underway. He reflected that past Councils have been very diverse but have worked well together, and expressed his appreciation to the current Council for allowing him to continue to stay involved in serving the community, most recently through his participation in the Wayzata Crime Prevention Coalition. During his tenure as a City Council member and as Mayor, he placed a priority on "shop local" and highlighted a few accomplishments made by Council including installation of an

emergency gate for Highway 12 access, a carp removal project, and implementation of a green technologies ordinance. He expressed his interest in continuing to be involved in Council and community.

He also indicated that he views the Metropolitan Council required Comprehensive Plan update as a priority the City will be facing, and expressed disappointment in the Comprehensive Plan update requirement; as well as in the City's representation on the Metropolitan Council, noting that Commissioners have failed to visit with Long Lake City Councils over the years.

Mayor Schneider indicated that representatives of Metropolitan Council had scheduled a joint meeting opportunity he was invited to three weeks prior; however, another City cancelled out of the meeting, and the representative cancelled the meeting entirely with assurances of future rescheduling.

Mayor and Council expressed appreciation to Mr. Miner and Mr. Hultmann for their interest and applications made. It was noted that the Council would be taking action to appoint a candidate to fill the Council vacancy during the regular City Council meeting following the work session.
